Life's a beach | Referencing the recognizable form of the seaside lilo, Blow by the experimental Italian furniture brand Gufram is a daybed that, according to its designers, "brings inside the home a holiday feeling that can last all year long."

Blow is the work of Emanuele Magini and comprises a polyurethane foam bed supported by four minimal legs in tubular aluminium. The lining is Waterborn, a specialist fabric manufactured by the Danish textiles company Kvadrat that offers 70 per cent water and 35 per cent carbon savings in comparison with alternative microfibre fabrics.
